THE SACRED HEART PIONEER




As we announced at the Closing Tournament, the new logo this season is an icon image of the Sacred Heart Pioneer. Sacred Heart University (SHU) was founded in 1963 as a Catholic Institution by the Second Bishop of Bridgeport, Connecticut, one Walter William Curtis. The founding of SHU came after Bishop Curtis had spent time at the Second Vatican Council starting in 1962. Bishop Curtis founded the university with the intention of furthering one of the main themes of the Second Vatican Council, the growth of the power of the laity in the Catholic Church. Therefore, when Bishop Curtis founded Sacred Heart University, he decided to pioneer the first institution that was fully run by a lay person of the Catholic Church. Until this point, the Presidents, Headmasters, and Principals of Catholic institutions had all been either priests or nuns. Since then and continuing in Bishop Curtis's idea, the Presidents and Administrators at Sacred Heart University have been a part of the laity of the Catholic Church. The Sacred Heart Pioneer, affectionately known as Big Red, has been the perfect representation of the University and will become the consummate representation of

Great River Golf Club for the future.






GREENS & GROUNDS

I hope everyone is having a great off-season and is as excited for the 2023 golf season as I am. As the new Golf Course Superintendent here at Great River, the past few weeks have been very busy with preparation for the upcoming season and the remaining irrigation project. We have had a very mild winter thus far, which has allowed my team to get out on the course and clean up many areas of the course.

The team has been busy addressing many areas of the course that have become overgrown and have taken away from the course aesthetics. By removing some lower vegetation and small saplings, we are recapturing many lost views and creating a better line of sight for tee shots. These areas will be maintained annually so that we can maintain the course's incredible architecture and visuals.

My focus this season will be course details, conditioning, and consistency on all playing surfaces. Getting the course ready for the season will begin with spring aerification. We plan to begin our aerification practices around mid to late March (weather dependent), with an estimated completion date around the last week of March. As this is a very disruptive process to the course, some of the benefits of



aerification is, increasing surface drainage, thatch reduction, which lower levels of thatch will decrease disease pressure in the summer months, and reduction of compaction; all these items will promote healthier growing conditions during the season.

Our tentative processes will be as follows:

1. Greens and Approaches $-\frac{1}{2}$ " core aerification on all greens; we will clean up all spoils and backfill holes with new sand. This process will continue to deplete and manage our organic material, increasing surface drainage and soil oxygen. We







will apply any necessary soil amendments to correct deficiencies.

2. Tee's -5/8" solid tine aerification on all tees, including the driving range tee. This will be followed up with deep verti-cutting and sand topdressing. The additional sand will also firm up tee surfaces for improved playability.

3. Fairways – We will verti-cut fairways and clean up all debris. This process will create firmer fairway conditions, and decreasing thatch will create a healthier growing environment.

Since my start in early January, my other main focus has been creating a more organized maintenance facility. Creating this environment for our team will

translate to a better organized and more productive team, ultimately creating better conditions for the membership. This will be something I will maintain week to week so my team takes pride in the workplace and the equipment we have.

As we begin this season, our irrigation installation contractor will start back up around April 1st. I am sure many of you are asking why we have not continued through the winter with the mild temperatures we had, and I had some of the same questions for them when I started. This is mainly because they could never have forecasted the winter we have this year, along with a good portion





of their staff being on a work visa. They plan to be back on site April 1st. That said, I will have a more detailed breakdown of the timeline and exact plans for completion. We will strive to complete the remaining 14 holes and practice areas by June 1st. Thank you for your continued support and cooperation during this project.

I look forward to meeting many of you around the club and out on the course over the coming months. As the Greens and Grounds team strives to create the best conditions in the area, should you have any suggestions or comments, please do not hesitate to stop in my office or send me an email.
