

GREENS & GROUNDS



I can officially say we are in the dog days of summer. We have had our fair share of heat and humidity for July, and it looks as if it might continue. As for the golf course, many things have been going well despite what mother nature throws at us.

Here are a few things to recap from July. After only about 2 weeks of our new irrigation system being fully

operational, we sustained a significant lightning strike on July 4th, on hole #3. This lightning strike along with

unconfirmed others had severely damaged the irrigation system along with many other utilities on the property. With help from the irrigation install company and

suppliers, we have been working on getting all 200+ irrigation heads repaired in a timely manner. Fortunately, mother nature has delivered some rain for much of July, so the visible turf decline has been minimal. We are currently working with our vendors and irrigation consultant on a plan to help mitigate future widespread damage.

Following our lightning strike damage, we hosted the inaugural Hartford Healthcare Women's Championship; despite the roller coaster of weather delays, the tournament was very successful. We were able to showcase the golf course very well for the players and had some fantastic feedback. Thank you for giving up the golf course for the week, and a special thank you to those who came out to volunteer for the event.

Following the tournament, we did a small core aerification on the greens. This process mid-season to remove a small core, aids in creating healthy growing conditions for our sensitive greens in the summer months. Removing a minimal amount of material creates an open-air column allowing for air and water to enter the soil for a more extended period of time. This small core removal process also is a quick and and easy process for staff and continues to help deplete organic matter buildup.



The golf course has been doing very well with above-average rainfall for July. We have been monitoring a few thin areas on the greens and adjusting some mowing practices to help the turf recover. Typically, it is challenging to have grass recover much this time of year due to the heat, humidity, and overnight temperatures. Once we get some cooler nights, the grass will begin to recover, and we can continue with some other maintenance practices that we have taken a back seat, like rolling.

As summer continues, please be patient as you will see members of our team out on the course watering during the afternoon hours. If you see irrigation heads running, they will typically only be on for a few minutes. Or if you see one of our team members hand watering on a green or fairway, please make sure they see you prior to taking your next shot.

The Greens and Grounds team appreciates your time with course care.
